Sap Bush Hollow cuts social media for a trial run

It was a cyber-hack of night- year olds down to the tech-savvy mare proportions. Hackers from Hanoi entered through my Facebook account, worked their way through our savings, checking and credit cards. The farm's funds were all put on lock-down. My Facebook access was disabled, making it impossible for me to update Sap Bush Hollow's Facebook and Instagram pages.

I should have been lying awake at night, fearing how our business was going to continue reaching our customer base without social media, or devising some kind of workaround.

Instead, I slept peacefully, relieved for the opportunity to let the tripod and lighting equipment used to generate social media posts collect some dust in the corner of the cafe kitchen. As January snows blew through West Fulton, we sat over coffee with mom, dad and the farm crew at Sap Bush Hollow and asked the unimaginable question:

Could the farm and cafe survive without using social media as a marketing tool?


Everyone, from the seventy

teens, was in startling agreement:

We all hated the presence of social media in our lives.

We hated having to capture or style every moment on the farm and cafe for a camera. We hated trying to adhere to social media etiquette by scrolling and engaging with our feed. We hated wasting valuable minutes each day coming up with the right hashtags, or crafting content that was shocking enough or funny enough or sexy enough or angry enough to please the fickle algorithms so that they'd actually broadcast our posts. We hated living the contradiction of perpetually posting on social media to try to get people to do the opposite of what they were actually doing: put down their phones and come up to West Fulton to spend some time having breakfast and connecting with family, land and community.

And so, rather than trying to recover our social media accounts, Sap Bush Hollow abandoned them for a one year experiment, to see if our absence

would impact our family business. We kept up with our blog and online newsletter, then did everything else offline. We found ourselves thankful for the bricksand-mortar infrastructure that still exists here in Schoharie County to help local businesses connect with customers: The Times Journal, Race Printing, our local post offices. And at the end of the year, contrary to popular opinion, our business didn't crumble with our digital silence. Sales didn't falter. They increased. Better still, we found ourselves spending more time upping our game on the farm and

in the cafe: making better decisions with farm management, trying out new recipes in the cafe, experimenting with new and better offerings in the 24hour Honor Store. We also found ourselves with time to enjoy life more — we had more family dinners, more nights playing music with our friends, more direct conversations with our customers with digital devices out of sight.

Literacy Volunteers offer opportunity

Anyone who needs a high others, only elementary. school equivalency diploma should contact Literacy Volun-

Volunteer tutors can help people bridge that education gap—and the service is free.

Literacy Volunteers' full name is Literacy New York—Fulton, Montgomery and Schoharie Counties, and its mission is to help adult students with reading, writing and math.

Although the program is open to anyone needing those skills, the great demand recently is for people seeking a high school diploma, or a GED. Reaching that goal is essential for students looking to land a job or get a better job than they already have.

"Every single person who calls, every one, is looking for a GED," said Lisa Cardilli, Literacy Volunteers' executive director.

We're the only game in town, the only organization that does

Each tutor works one-on-one with a student in a neutral, quiet setting, such as a library or a church. Weekly sessions take about two hours, and there's homework.

"Our tutors are lovely, dedicated people," said Ms. Cardilli. "They're volunteering their time to teach."

Instruction may last a year, give or take, depending on an incoming student's skills. Some are close to high school level;

Tutors lead the way, but students must be committed.

"They have to want to do this," Ms. Cardilli said. "There's a goal, a worthy goal, but they need a good attitude and a strong work

Ms. Cardilli has necessary supplies, including calculators and even bus tokens for students with transportation issues.

Successful students aren't cast

staff make them aware of job opportunities that have better pay and health care.

Also, the staff remains in touch for six months to see how students are doing and whether they need help.

SEEC: Fostering Schoharie County growth

Throughout 2022, Schoharie Economic Enterprise Corporation (SEEC), continued progress toward the organizational mission of fostering economic growth in Schoharie County.

In a pivot from the reactive and problem-solving efforts needed to address the pandemic, 2022 offered a chance to plow forward with the intention to focus on priority initiatives – Digital, Industrial and Main Street Development.

Listening to the business community, SEEC worked with alliances to secure and direct meaningful resources that strengthened small businesses, aided industrial development and revisited plans to bolster the character of local Main Streets, all of which are at the heart of SEEC's work enhancing the physical and social character of Schoharie County communities.

Powering a digital revolution.

The need to close the digital divide for rural communities was heightened throughout the pandemic, and SEEC proactively worked with the County Office of Community Development to leverage funding to build new small business platforms.

Together, they also directed American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) investments to broadband build-out planning. Boosted efforts rolled out as SEEC established a Digital Marketing Help Desk and introduced a Digital Series, hosting experts to discuss various topics to improve small business digital skills.

Over the one-year, the SEEC-led deployment of the Community Development Block Grant, the program funded 26 local businesses, representative of nine different towns.

After the first round of \$366,000 had been exhausted, the need for additional funding was demonstrated by the volume of qualifying applications. SEEC successfully petitioned the State for an additional \$375,000.

The grants served nearly 60 percent women-led organizations, each utilizing e-commerce tools and social media platforms to expand customer engagement and bolster sales revenue. A resilient approach that also retained more than 42 jobs and created 16 new jobs throughout 2022

Small businesses were able to engage world-class marketing professionals to build or improve digital marketing tools along with the training needed to ensure the platforms could be leveraged with best-practice strategies for years ahead.

For example, check out the new Wood and Wool Podcast on Facebook, a result of the program dollars enabling the shop owner to learn from other blind entrepreneurs.

Leveraging another \$100,000 from the Community Development Block Grant program, SEEC and the County were able to collaborate with the Village of Schoharie to install a free village WiFi network, which is now live.

Anticipating broadband infrastructure funding availability, SEEC also requested \$100,000 of the County's American Rescue Plan Act funds be directed to broadband planning efforts towards ensuring every home and business in Schoharie County has access to the internet.

SEEC triggered Schoharie County's digital revolution and supports the 21st century economy that is essential to ensure that Schoharie County is a place people want to live, work and enjoy life for generations to

A place worthy of investment.

SEEC is attracting new and deliberate private investments to the County. SEEC worked to support industrial development efforts in alignment with County "Shaping the Way Forward" strategies, site readiness analysis and a payoff matrix where high effort leads to high rewards.

SEEC recognizes the importance of the agricultural identity - historically, socially and economically for the region.

Utilizing funding from Appalachian Regional Commission matched by SEEC, a Regional Independent Food Processing Plan and seven Roadmaps were delivered in 2022.

SEEC established a volunteer Farm and Food Advisory Council to inform the planning process and hired the consultation team that engaged 85 ag-related organizations to provide insights into their experiences and needs.

The resulting Plan highlights the work of 11 organizations

poised to make upwards of \$6 million investments among the tri-county service area - Schoharie, Otsego & Delaware Counties. Ongoing efforts will focus on "solving logistics" improving local supply chains and creating a more prosperous regional agriculture community.

In support of the recommendations of the county adopted corridor development strategies and MRB Group proposed industrial site assessments, SEEC coordinated site tours engaging elected officials and development professionals to better understand the opportunities at the I-88 interchanges and Route 7 commercial corridor.

Advancing the work, SEEC requested \$750,000 of American Rescue Plan Act investments toward site readiness. The County Board of Supervisors agreed.

SEEC is poised to further assist the towns along the corridor leverage FAST NY grant funding to make infrastructure improvements necessary to accommodate larger-scale developments which bring new job opportunities, increase the tax base, and generate more sales tax revenue off-setting real property taxes.

An additional \$460,000 Empire State Development Capital Grant was secured by SEEC to assist with the construction of a 40,000 sq ft facility.

The proposed Highbridge Development off of the I-88 exit 23 in Schoharie has received SEECs endorsement as a proposed \$75 million investment to induce hundreds of jobs and demonstrate the value of the local transportation routes.

Collectively reimagine, reinvent and rejuvenate.

Since SEEC's establishment, maintaining the character of the community and supporting efforts that make Schoharie County a place people want to build their lives, has been a cornerstone of the organization's efforts.

2022 offered more opportunities to realize those efforts.

New York State announced a new funding opportunity to support community revitalization through a program titled NY Forward. SEEC worked with both the Village of Schoharie and the Village of Sharon Springs to apply to the program in September. The award amounts range between \$2.25 and \$4.5 million.

SEEC was proud to cut the ribbon on 287 Main, the new headquarters for economic development and coworking space.

The office was the former Bank of America which underwent a robust renovation in 2022 and formally opened in September 2022. The space has created a 21st-century hub for professionals, creatives, small businesses, and more, right in the heart of the Village of Schoharie.

To enhance the resources available, a variety of programs were launched meant to create learning and networking opportunities.

Programs included Women Leading Business, the Digital Marketing Learning Series, the Digital Marketing Help Desk and Resource Roundtables.

To culminate the year and to honor collaborations in 2022, honorary chairs Tom and Dusty Putnam hosted the first-annual Toast to the Town. The event offered a chance to enjoy local flavors, with catering

by Farmer's Beef and Brew, and local beverages from Middleburgh Winery, Wayward Lane and a signature cocktail featuring Sauvage Distillery Kosher Vodka.

As a lead-up to the event, SEEC announced a call for nominations for the newly established Enlighten and Aspire Awards.

Schoharie River Center was the recipient of the Enlighten Award, honoring an organization that filled educational gaps supporting Schoharie County's resiliency.

The Aspire Award, meant to recognize an individual or organization that has ascended or transcended in their industry, was granted to Tina Wellman, CEO of BrightDrive Healthcare Solutions.

SEEC looks forward to welcoming guests to 287 Main in 2023 and will Toast to the Town in December again.


