

Students, tutors rewarded in Literacy

Rewards abound for anyone and everyone involved with Literacy Volunteers.

Students are rewarded by improving their lives, and tutors are rewarded for helping students reach their goals.

Literacy Volunteers—the full name is Literacy New York-Fulton, Montgomery and Schoharie Counties—has volunteer tutors teach adults reading, writing and math skills.

The service is free.

"We're the only adult education option in Schoharie County," said Lisa Cardilli, executive director.

"Our tutors are dedicated, wonderful people, and our students are determined to reach their goals."

Those goals are often achieving a high school diploma, landing a job or getting a better job. A side benefit: Students gain dignity

Ms. Cardilli and her small staff work with dozens of tutors who meet one-on-one with students once per week.

Sessions are in a library, church or another quiet, neutral setting. Each session is about two hours, and there's homework.

Students have different skill levels. Some have a partial high school education; others have much less.

The organization has 90 to

100 students, and less than onequarter of them are ready for high school-level classes. For those students, remedial instruction is necessary, especially in writing and math.

When they complete remedial education, students move on to the curriculum, which takes about a year.

Ms. Cardilli's office supplies all the materials, including calculators, and even bus tokens if transportation's an issue for students.

"We help them as much as we can," Ms. Cardilli said. "At the same time, students have to want to do this. They need to bring a good attitude and a strong work ethic."

Tutors receive training as well, and Ms. Cardilli tries to match them with students for the most beneficial pairings.

And it pays off.

In the past month, Literacy Volunteers had four students earn their high school diplomas, and two are planning to attend college. All are working full time.

"These students entered the program needing extensive tutoring, and with the help of our wonderful tutors, they achieved their goals," Ms. Cardilli said.

Known statewide for her work with Literacy, Ms. Cardilli designed a program to help with reading fluency among low-level learners. She's also an advocate for literacy funding and works to increase awareness of low literacy.

"It's a challenging but a wonderful and rewarding experience," said Ms. Cardilli, who for years has been a tutor herself.

Literacy NY has offices in Cobleskill, where Ms. Cardilli is based, and in Gloversville.

A fundraiser for Literacy NY, the event has two-, three- and four-person teams compete in three SCRABBLE games, all with different rules.


Total points in the three

Meetings are at 6:30pm on the second Monday of the month in town hall, 300 Main Street, Schoharie.



SEEC Advisors have been major proponents of the local Digital Revolution. Most notable, a testament to his leadership, SEEC founding Board member Jim Becker, President and CEO of MIDTEL and INOC Datacenters, was appointed by Governor Hochul to serve on the state-wide Broadband Deployment Advisory Committee, a designated 16-member council to guide broadband expansion investments across New York State.

Main Street Vitality: Revitalizing the heart of our communities is a SEEC priority. 2024 will prove to be a year of vibrant growth and exciting developments. The eagerly anticipated Parrott House project will commence in March, while the Adler welcomes new ownership and world-class Japanese hospitality investors seek approvals in Sharon Springs.
